Hi,

I almost pulled my hair out installing radicore since i kept getting the error that the audit schema did not exist. but through farther debugging, i realized that although the system was connecting to postgresql, it was connecting to the wrong database - the postgresql default db.

the way i solved this was to change the code in dml.pgsql.inc and changing the order of parameters for the connection from pg\_connect("host=\$host,user=\$user,pass=\$pass,db=\$db") to pg\_connect("host=\$host,db=\$db,user=\$user,pass=\$pass") - not the exact syntax but you can see the change in the location of the dbase parameter.
