Make sure that the Apache user and FTP user are part of the same group, then make sure that all folders and files to which the application need to write have write access at the group level.

If you cannot do this the only alternative is to change the folder/file permissions to 777.

The exports are done from the MENU and DICT databases, and these do not contain user data.

I develop everything on my PC, perform the exports on my PC, then copy the exported files (.class.inc and .dict.inc) to the production server. I don't bother updating the DICT database on the production server as I never use it.

When I change the contents of the MENU database for a subsystem I export the changes from the AUDIT system then load those changes directly into the MENU database on the production server.
