An example for this usage:

Sales Rep queries data in front of customer. Changing too many screens might not be ideal reason being he might forget his previous query or wishes to fine tune query with more criteria.

What exactly is the update you are trying to implement? You say you are trying to assign up to 100+ records to a salesman, but are all of these records already assigned to a different salesman? Do you want to transfer all records from salesman A to salesman B? Or do you wish to transfer just some of the records from salesman A to salesman B? Do you want to select the salesman first, then the records you want to associated with this salesman? Or do you want to select the select the records first, then choose the salesman?

Depending on your exact requirements the solution could involve different sets of transaction patterns.
